Social studies and the humanities present unique challenges to struggling learners: complex stories, abstract concepts such as "citizenship," a huge disciplinary

What is Accessing Inquiry? What does it offer?

Accessing Inquiry offers strategies to teach History, Social Science, and the Humanities to ALL learners. Examine the framework, Universal Design for Learning—supporting excellence for all by offering multiple paths to understanding. Integrate the histories of people with disabilities and of immigrant and foreign language communities into your curriculum—often through topics that you already teach! Gain strategies to know and support diverse students, to empower them to ask good guestions, to engage them in deep thinking, and to assess what they are learning.

Why we focus on Disability History



- Engage learners with history they see selves in
- Correct demeaning views (such as insulting terms)
- Model putting primary sources in context
- Expand historical record to include all people
- Address new standards (in growing number of states)




Why focus on Disability History?

An estimated 38 million eligible voters have disabilities. It has always been hard for them to vote, and this year has brought even more obstacles.






